Q26. Give a pen picture of the life- style of the early man.

Ans: Early men did not live a settled life. The lives of the early man were not very different from those of other animals. They spent all the day prowling about in the jungles and in swamp, protecting them from other beasts and searching for food. Life consisted of digging up roots, trapping animals, and birds for food and killing them with stone tools. They had to take whatever nature provided.

Hunting and gathering food were their main occupations. They ate fruits, nuts, roots, meat etc. They lived on the branches of trees and in caves. People wore skins of animals or barks to keep them warm. They used stones, bones, tusk etc. to make their tools which they used for scrapping, hunting, cutting, digging etc. People lived a nomadic life and moved from place to place in search of food and shelter.

During the stone age density of population was very low and human lived in 'bands'—small communities consisted of a group of 30 to 50 people with no leader.
